Submitting a blog post...



1. Spark an idea.

2. Ask questions.

3. Put pen to paper.

Blog posts are written in a **conversational style** for a non-academic audience.



4. Submit for review. Send your blog post via email to rsablog@regionalstudies.org.

Submission requirements...

Please send the following items to rsablog@regionalstudies.org

A Word document (.doc or .docx) that includes:

- Text of your blog post that is between 500-800 words.
- Credentials, institutional affiliation (if applicable), and position/title of all authors.
- Any funding received that supported your work.
- At least two sources referenced (and linked if available online).
- Country (or countries) and any specific region (such as province, state, or other regional definition) relevant to your article.
- One headshot of each author (.png or .jpeg naming each file to match each author).
- One or more (preferably more) images (.png or .jpeg) that accompany the blog post, ideally from your research site or a location relevant to your article.
